Purpose of Survey

- Gather feedback on the voting patterns
- Determine priorities the community sees for the district

Respondents (1,111)

- 71.9% had children who attended the Lynbrook Schools
- 12.8% were residents whose children are no longer school age
- 9.7% were senior citizens
- 4.1% were residents with children under the age of 5
- 1.6% had children attending private/parochial schools

Of those respondents:

- 54.7% voted "Yes"
- 44.4% voted "No"
- .8% did not vote

Of those respondents:

- 42.3% were fully aware of the need for space issues at the high school
- 41.1% had a good sense of the space issues
- 16.6% had a fair sense or no awareness at all

Best Way to Obtain Information

- 54.7% Direct Mail
- 23.4% Social Media
- 12.3% Automated Phone Call
- 2.8% Email
- .4% Lynbrook APP

Awareness of Other Capital Projects in the District

- 72.6% "Yes"
- 23.1% "No"

Attendance at the Forum or Building Walk-Through

- 75.3% "No"
- 23.2% "Yes"

Priority Order for a “Yes” Vote

% Below represent the combination of most important and second most important:

- 81.2% STEAM Classrooms
- 49.8% Total Scope of Projects
- 30.8% Instructional Music Classrooms

Priority Reason for a "No" Vote

% Below represent the combination of most important and second most important:

- 85% Financial
- 45.7% No Need for Theatre
- 25.6% No Need for Instructional Music Classrooms
