

Dear Lynbrook School Community,

At our June 14 Board of Education meeting, we approved a resolution to move forward with a revised bond proposal that will be put before voters on Tuesday, October 3. The new proposal reduces the size of the original March 2016 bond by approximately \$15 million in response to community feedback, maintaining elements that were deemed most important by our residents.

The proposed \$33.9 million project will enhance the facilities at all school buildings, including the construction of a 33,274-square foot, two-story addition at Lynbrook High School to increase educational opportunities, expand facilities and accommodate our students' growing academic successes. The proposed additions and improvements throughout the district include:

- Addition of **air conditioning** in all elementary school gymnasiums (Marion Street, Waverly Park, West End and the Kindergarten Center)
- Upgrades to North Middle School **locker rooms**, including the coach's office
- Upgrades of the **locker rooms** at South Middle School, including the coach's office and team rooms
- Addition of **air conditioning** in both North Middle and South Middle schools gymnasiums
- Renovation of the **girls' softball locker room** at Atlantic Avenue
- Refurbishment of the Atlantic Avenue **wrestling** room
- Expanded and modernized **science facilities** at the high school, including creation of a STEAM center and upgrades to the Science Research classroom
- Creation of a **classroom** for the high school Career Development Program
- Renovation of the existing high school **auditorium**, including upgrades to its sound system, seating, lighting, rigging and acoustics
- Create and properly equip high school classroom allocation for **music** instruction
- Construction of a school store at the high school, which will provide on campus opportunities to learn **business** skills
- Modernize high school **art** classrooms

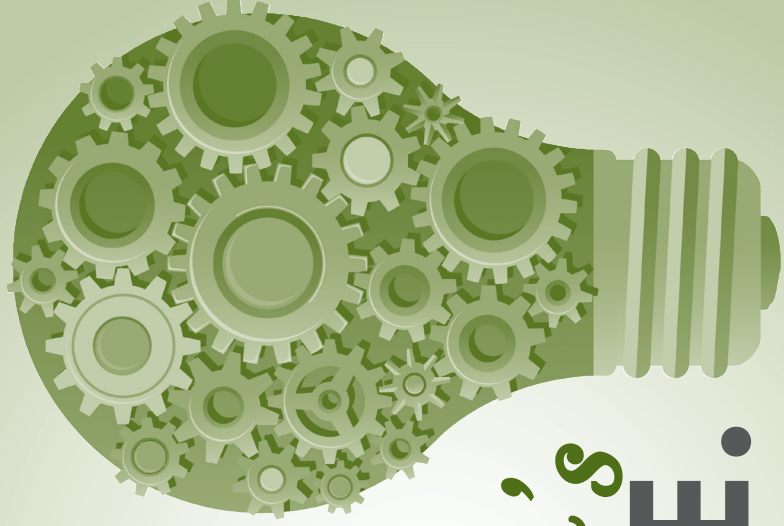
If approved by residents, only \$28.9 million of the \$33.9 million project will be bonded. The district will utilize \$5 million from its capital reserve to fund the remainder of the project.

We would like to thank members of the community who have shared their input with us, whether through participation in the post-bond survey or through comments at Board meetings. We value your feedback and hope you will agree that the proposed plan is a true representation of our collaboration together. We look forward to sharing more information about this project with you in the coming months as we prepare for a community vote on October 3.

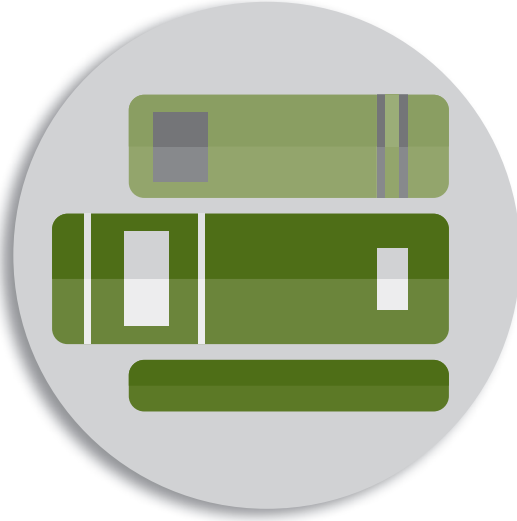
