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RE: Driver Education in-car procedures

Please note the following procedures and recommendations regarding supervising your child's in-car experience in driver education.

Please print the Curriculum Guidelines, and the driving and observation logs that have been emailed to you. You will need to familiarize yourself with the guidelines prior to conducting driving sessions.

The curriculum and the logs for the program are broken up into 16 sessions (or classes). This is based upon the typical 16-week driver education program where one class is taught per week. It is possible to complete multiple sessions in one week (or even within one driving session) with your child. It is highly recommended that you distinguish between driving times to get your child more general experience, specifically to accomplish the tasks in the curriculum. However, this can be combined into one driving time with your child, if more convenient.

After you have completed the first driving session, you need to have your child sign the log in the box for the first session and email a copy of the log to the following email address:

You can also email any questions you have regarding the sessions you have completed, or lessons in the future. We will do our best to answer any questions in a timely fashion. You should email a copy of your log every week, regardless of the number of sessions you have done, until 16 sessions are completed. We will contact you if there are any issues regarding the record keeping of your logs.

For completing your child's observation requirements, please click the hyperlink observation videos. <https://www.youtube.com/channel/UCqX7VuFb5oNdEDOlgbm9QdQ/videos> These videos give an unobstructed view of what a student would see while the 16 driving sessions are being completed. It is equally important that parents watch the videos as well as the students. Parents will hear different ways of instructing their child through the different tasks of the driving course, as well as help them gain some "instructor speak". It is also highly recommended that parents and their children watch the videos together, thereby fostering a greater air of cooperation in this collaborative educational effort.

To keep safety & educational levels of this current unique driver education course at acceptable levels, parents are effectively being given a 'crash' course in being a driving instructor.
