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THE DIGNITY ACT

New York State's Dignity for All Students Act was signed into law on September 13, 2010, and took effect on July 1, 2012. This legislation amended state education law by creating a new Article 2 – Dignity for All Students. The Dignity Act also amended Section 801-a of New York State education law regarding instruction in civility, citizenship and character education by expanding the concepts of tolerance, respect for others and dignity to include: an awareness and sensitivity in the relations of people, including but not limited to different races, weights, national origins, ethnic groups, religions, religious practices, mental or physical abilities, sexual orientations, gender identity and sexes. The Dignity Act further amended Section 2801 of the education law by requiring boards of education to include language addressing the Dignity Act in their codes of conduct.

On or before July 1, 2012, schools were required to implement school employee training programs, commencing with the 2012-13 school year and thereafter, to promote a positive school environment that is free from discrimination and harassment and to discourage and respond to incidents of discrimination and/or harassment on school property or at a school function.

As prescribed by the Dignity Act, at least one employee in every school shall be designated as a Dignity Act coordinator. The designation of each Dignity Act coordinator shall be approved by the Board of Education, trustees or sole trustee of the school district.

REQUIRED NOTICES AS PER EVERY STUDENT SUCCEEDS ACT (ESSA) LEGISLATION

President Obama signed ESSA legislation into law on December 10, 2015. This legislation covers all states, school districts and schools that accept Title I federal grants. The primary focus of Title I is to improve the academic achievement of disadvantaged students. For school districts receiving Title I funds, there are a number of notices which must be shared with the public. These notices are described below.

PROFESSIONAL QUALIFICATIONS OF TEACHERS

Parents have a right to request and receive specific information as to the professional qualifications of their child's teachers and paraprofessionals. These are persons who have met NYSED qualifications and licensing criteria for grade levels and subject areas in which instruction is provided. Our teacher assistants are also licensed by the State Education Department. Please request information, in writing, through the Superintendent's Office.

MILITARY RECRUITING

Parents of high school students: Districts receiving federal education funds under the Every Student Succeeds Act, upon request, provide military recruiters and institutions of higher learning the names, addresses and telephone numbers of high school students. This is unless students and their parents exercise their right to prohibit release of the information without prior written parental consent. In addition, districts must provide military recruiters with the same access to high school students generally provided to colleges and universities or prospective employers.

OPTING OUT OF STATE ASSESSMENTS

The state requires that the Lynbrook Union Free School District offer Grades 3-8 English Language Arts (ELA), Grades 3-8 Mathematics, and Grades 5 and 8 Science tests to all students. However, there is no penalty for students whose parents inform the district of their decision to have their children opt out of these tests. The New York State Education Department has recognized

the absolute right of parents to have their children opt out of state assessment tests. We are required to offer these tests to everyone, but students are not required to take the tests.

PLACEMENT IN A LANGUAGE INSTRUCTION PROGRAM BILINGUAL OR ENGLISH AS A NEW LANGUAGE PROGRAM

Parent Notification: Pursuant to the Every Student Succeeds Act and Commissioner's Regulations, parents or guardians must be notified of their child's placement in a manner and/or language that they can understand, be it a language instruction educational program, instructional bilingual or English as a New Language program. Parents must be informed of their options regarding their child's placement in any such program. Parent notification is required by the district within 30 days after the start of the school year, or within two weeks of placement in a program when the student was not identified as limited English proficient before the start of the school year.

EQUAL ACCESS

School districts that allow outside groups to use public facilities may not deny access to or discriminate against youth groups listed as a patriotic society in Title 36 of the U.S. Code, based on the group's membership or leadership criteria or oath of allegiance to God and country. Patriotic society youth groups include, for example, Scouting America, the Girl Scouts and the Boys and Girls Clubs of America.

UNIVERSAL FREE SCHOOL MEALS PROGRAM



The Lynbrook School District believes that one of the most important ways we can help our children perform better in their classrooms is to provide them with the nutrition necessary for the healthy growth of their minds and bodies. We invite students to participate in the food service program. New York State's Universal Free School Meals program begins this school year, providing meals at no cost to students. See the District's website for more information. If the Universal Free School Meals program ends, students may buy breakfast for \$3.00 and lunch for \$4.25 each day. Children from households that meet federal income guidelines are eligible for free meals or reduced-price meals regardless of whether the Universal Free School Meals program continues.

If the Universal Free School Meals program mentioned above ends, the Board of Education recognizes that, on occasion, students may forget to bring meal money to school. To ensure that students do not go hungry, but also to promote responsible student behavior and minimize the fiscal burden to the district, the Board will allow students who may forget meal money to "charge" the cost of meals to be paid back at a later date. IMPORTANT VOTER INFORMATION

Who Is Eligible to Vote?

- 1. Must be a U.S. citizen,
- 2. Must be over the age of 18,
- 3. Must have resided in the school district for at least 30 days before the budget vote, and
- 4. Must be a registered voter.

Are You Registered?

If you are uncertain as to whether you are registered in the school district and eligible to vote, call the district clerk at 516-887-6558 between 8 a.m. and 4 p.m. If you are not currently registered, you may register in the office of the district clerk, Monday through Friday, 8 a.m.-4 p.m. up to and including Wednesday, May 13, 2026, or register with the Board of Registration of the Lynbrook Union Free School District on the registration day to be held Wednesday, May 13, 2026, from 4-8 p.m. at Lynbrook High School.

If you are uncertain about whether you are registered for general elections, call the Board of Elections in Mineola at 516-571-2411 or go to https://voterlookup.elections.ny.gov.

Do You Need an Absentee/Early Mail Ballot?

Pursuant to Section 2018-a of the Education Law of the State of New York, absentee/early mail ballots may be cast for the election of members of the Board of Education and budget. Information pertaining to applications for absentee/early mail ballots may be obtained by calling the district clerk at 516-887-6558.

Applications for absentee/early mail ballots for election of school board members and for voting on the school budget are to be completed on a form prescribed by the state board of elections and may be obtained by visiting the New York State Education Department's website or by contacting the district clerk by email (Theresa.moran@lynbrookschools.org) or phone (516-887-6558). Completed applications must be received at least seven days before the election if the ballot is to be mailed to the applicant, or the day before the election if the ballot is to be delivered personally to the applicant or designated agent.

SEXUAL HARASSMENT OF EMPLOYEES POLICY

Sexual harassment in the workplace is illegal and all employees are forbidden from engaging in such activity. The Board of Education is committed to providing a work environment free from all forms of sexual harassment or intimidation. Conduct is deemed to be sexual harassment when the recipient perceives such behavior as unwelcome. It is irrelevant that the harasser had no intent to sexually harass the person. The Board recognizes that sexual harassment can originate from a person of either sex against a person of the opposite or same sex, and from peers as well as supervisors. Therefore, the Board condemns all unwelcome behavior of a sexual nature which is either designed to directly extort sexual favors from an employee as a term or condition of employment or which has the purpose or effect of creating an intimidating, hostile or offensive working environment. The Board also strongly opposes any retaliatory behavior against complainants or any witnesses. Any employee who believes that he or she has been subjected to sexual harassment should report the alleged misconduct immediately so that appropriate corrective action, up to and including discharge of the offender, may be taken at once. In the absence of a victim's complaint, the Board, upon learning of, or having reason to suspect, the occurrence of any sexual misconduct, will ensure that an investigation is promptly commenced by appropriate individuals. Copies of the entire policy are given to all supervisory and nonsupervisory personnel and are posted in appropriate places within the district. A copy of the entire Sexual Harassment of Employees Policy is available in the Superintendent's Office and may be examined upon request.

DISTRICT DRUG POLICY

The Board of Education is committed to the prevention of alcohol and other substance use/abuse. The term "alcohol and/or other substances" shall be construed throughout this policy to refer to all substances including, but not limited to, alcohol, inhalants, marijuana, cocaine, LSD, PCP, amphetamines, depressants, heroin, steroids, lookalikes and any of those substances commonly referred to as "designer drugs." This policy describes the philosophy of the district and the program elements the district will use to promote healthy lifestyles for its students and to inhibit the use/abuse of alcohol and other substances.

No student may use, possess, sell or distribute alcohol or other substances, nor may use or possess drug paraphernalia, on school grounds or at school-sponsored events, except drugs as prescribed by a physician. The inappropriate use of prescription and over-the-counter drugs shall also be prohibited.

Additionally, the following persons shall be prohibited from entering school grounds or school-sponsored events: Any person exhibiting behavior, conduct, or personal or physical characteristics indicative of having used or consumed alcohol and/or other substances, or any person who school personnel have reasonable grounds to suspect has used alcohol and/or other substances.

To educate students on the dangers associated with substance abuse, the health education curriculum shall include instruction concerning drug use and abuse for ALL grades K-12. Any staff member observing narcotics or alcohol possession or usage by students on school grounds or during school-sponsored or supervised events shall report the incident immediately to the superintendent of schools or his or her designee. The superintendent or his or her designee shall then take immediate action. Any narcotics or alcohol found shall be confiscated immediately, followed by notification of the parent(s) or guardian of the student(s) involved and temporary suspension (up to five days) imposed. Such student shall also be subject to a long-term or permanent suspension following due process, in accordance with the law and referral for prosecution. In its effort to maintain a drug-free environment, the district shall cooperate to the fullest extent possible with local, state and/or federal law enforcement agencies.

If a student under 16 years of age is apprehended selling, using or in possession of narcotics or alcohol, the school will assist parents in making contact with the Juvenile Aid Bureau. The district will readmit a student when a program of action to help the student has been established by Juvenile Aid Bureau authorities and the student's parents.

The district will use the following principles as guides for the development of its substance use/abuse prevention efforts and for any disciplinary measures related to alcohol and other substances:

- Alcohol and/or other substance use/abuse is preventable and treatable.
- Alcohol and/or other substance use/abuse inhibits the district from carrying out its central
 mission of educating students.
- The behavior of the Board, the administration and all school staff should model the behavior asked of students.
- While the district can and must assume a leadership role in alcohol and other substance use/ abuse prevention, this goal will be accomplished only through collaborative, coordinated efforts with parents, students, staff and the community as a whole.

FERPA DIRECTORY INFORMATION POLICY AND NOTICE

Pursuant to the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), the Lynbrook School District maintains certain educational records, known as "directory information," which may be released without specific parental consent. Directory information includes a student's name, address, telephone number, date and place of birth, major course of study, participation in school activities or sports, weight and heights (BMI) if a member of an athletic team or for the state health department reporting, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, most recent school attended, class schedule, photograph, video, email address and class roster. From time to time, the school district takes photos and videos of students at work or play for use in local newspapers, television broadcasts, school publications and websites and other media outlets. If you do not wish any of the foregoing information about your child andlor photos or videos of your child to be released, please notify the school principal in writing or via PowerSchool update by Sept. 15, 2025.

DISTRICT COMPUTER NETWORK AND STUDENT RESPONSIBILITIES

The Board of Education of the Lynbrook Union Free School District is committed to optimizing student learning and teaching. To that end, the Board encourages the use of computers and computer-related technology in classrooms. All users of the district's computer network and the internet understand that access to the district's network is a privilege and not a right. They must comply with district policies and procedures regarding their use. (For further information, please refer to the district's Board of Education policies #4526, #4526R and #4526.1). Failure to comply may result in disciplinary action, including, but not limited to, the revocation of computer access privileges. Parents and students are required to review and acknowledge the acceptable use policy at the beginning of each school year.

PROTECTION OF PUPIL RIGHTS AMENDMENT (PPRA)

All survey, analysis, or evaluation that concerns a protected area will be conducted in accord with the Protection of Pupil Rights Amendment (PPRA). PPRA also concerns marketing surveys and other areas of student privacy, parental access to information, and the administration of certain physical examinations to minors. More information is available on our website.

INTERVENTION SERVICES

Do not wait until conference time if you think your child is having difficulty in school. Your first step should be to contact your child's teacher to address any concerns you may have with his or her progress. All secondary teachers offer extra help at least three times a week. Elementary teachers offer it twice a week. Please contact your child's teacher for the schedule.

Prior to requesting a multidisciplinary evaluation, teachers and/or building teams can suggest and offer in-school and at-home interventions to help your child. Your child may still be having difficulty, even after such interventions. You are entitled, at any time, to request a comprehensive educational and psychological evaluation to determine why your child may be having difficulty, and if the child qualifies for special services. ATTENDANCE

School attendance is a major component of academic success. The attendance policy will be included in student handbooks, and parents will receive a summary of this policy by mail at the start of the school year. Excused absences are defined as absences, tardiness and early departures from class or school due to personal illness, death in the family, impassable roads or weather, religious observance, quarantine, doctor or dental appointments which cannot be arranged for another time, court appearances, school-sponsored activities, college trips or job interviews and such other reasons as may be approved by administration.

Students in high school level courses must be in attendance in a class not less than 90% of the scheduled days of instruction to receive credit for the course. Absent totals reflect excused and unexcused absences. Three unexcused latenesses to class will equal one absence. It is the obligation of the student who was absent to consult with his or her teachers regarding missed schoolwork.

ACCOMMODATIONS FOR HEARING IMPAIRED

It is the policy of the Board of Education to provide hearing-impaired parents and individuals in parental relation equal opportunity for meaningful participation in school district meetings and activities, such as; parent-teacher conferences, special education meetings, conferences with counselors, career planning, suspension hearings or other disciplinary conferences with school officials. The school district will provide an interpreter for the hearing-impaired parent upon written request submitted to and received by the district five days prior to the scheduled meeting or activity. If a timely request for such services is received, these services will be made available at no cost to the parent. In the event that an interpreter is unavailable, the district will make other reasonable accommodations satisfactory to the parent.

504 COMPLIANCE

This policy of the Board of Education provides for equal rights and benefits for all individuals, and to recognize its obligation to avoid discrimination against individuals with handicaps in its policies and practices regarding students and personnel. No discrimination against individuals with handicaps will knowingly be tolerated in any program, practice or policy in the district. In keeping with its obligations, the district has appointed a Section 504 compliance officer, who is authorized to receive requests for accommodations or for the provision of particular services to individuals with handicaps.

The district is obligated to identify, evaluate and provide equal access for individuals with handicaps to all appropriate educational services. In the event a parent or person in parental relationship to an individual with a handicap disagrees with the determination made by the compliance officer or his designees, such a parent or person shall have the right to an impartial hearing to determine the appropriateness of such determination.

STUDENTS WHO ARE HOMELESS

Parents of students who are homeless and unaccompanied youth have rights and protections under the federal McKinney-Vento Homeless Education Assistance Act.

FLIGHT SCHOOL

The Lynbrook School District believes all learners have the ability to grow when presented with learning opportunities that appropriately challenge their skills and understanding. Towards that goal, the district developed Flight School to enrich the learning experience for all students grades two through five. Designated teachers will push into those classes on a rotating schedule to work alongside the classroom teacher to present high-interest units of study aligned to classroom goals. These units will feature hands-on learning experiences that foster the development of key 21st-century skills such as collaboration and communication. The Flight School Program empowers students to independently and cooperatively engineer innovative solutions through project-based challenges that enhance critical thinking and creativity. This dynamic enrichment experience fosters hands-on learning as students navigate the engineering design process, collaborate on research and design and present solutions to real-world problems, thereby developing essential skills for academic and life success. In grade three, students will be screened for giftedness, and based upon the results, students may be offered additional support.

NOTIFICATION OF ADVANCED COURSEWORK

Advanced coursework is offered in middle and high school, allowing students to gain skills and demonstrate competencies at a higher level. Details are available on both the middle and high school websites.

SUMMER PLAYGROUND

The district provides a summer playground program for all resident children from kindergarten through eighth grade. The program is conducted weekdays from 9 a.m.-12 p.m. Playground programs are offered at two campuses each summer and are staffed by teachers and college and high school students. Activities include sports and an arts and crafts program. Activities are conducted outdoors, weather permitting, and indoors on rainy days. Private and parochial school resident students are invited. Information will be posted on ParentSquare and the district website in the Spring.

Extended Summer Program: Kindergarten – Grade 5 (July - August: 6 Weeks)

Right at School offers an extended summer playground program immediately following the District's summer playground program, providing continued care and enrichment throughout the summer months.

SUMMER EVENING RECREATION PROGRAM

This program, held at Lynbrook Senior High School gym, is open to Lynbrook students entering grades 9-12 and graduated seniors. The program runs six weeks during the summer, from Monday through Thursday, from 6-9:30 p.m. Students may participate in basketball, volleyball, weightlifting and more.

SUMMER HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM

PURPOSE: The summer high school program is designed to serve students who have failed courses during the regular school year and desire to raise their scholastic standing. In addition to the regular summer school program, the district has instituted a one-week Regents Prep class. Information on this class will be available at registration.

STUDENTS ELIGIBLE TO ATTEND SUMMER HIGH SCHOOL: Resident students who are enrolled in grades 9-12 during the school year in public, private or parochial school are eligible to register for summer school. Enrollment of nonresident students will be limited to filling vacancies that exist after district students have registered.

SUMMER SCHOOL REGISTRATION INFORMATION:

- Personal registration is required. No phone or mail registration is permitted.
- Students desiring to register must present written approval of their home school principal or his or her deputy. They must also have proper proof of inoculation.
- Students are permitted to take only two subjects.
- Any subject listed will only be offered if there is sufficient enrollment.

SUMMER SCHOOL FEES: Nonresident students are required to pay a tuition fee per subject. Full registration and tuition payments must be paid by cash (no checks accepted) at registration time. A resident student is defined as living within the boundaries of the Lynbrook Union Free School District.

DRIVER EDUCATION

The district provides for two semesters of Driver Education during the regular school year, as well as one summer session. The coordinator of the Driver Education program is Eric Finder. He can be reached at 516-612-5160. Openings in Driver Education are limited, therefore:

- Resident students will be allowed to register first.
- The order of registration is by present class and date of birth. Proof of date of birth must be presented and student ID is required.

ADULT EDUCATION

A well-organized, self-supporting program of Adult Education is operated under the auspices of the Board of Education and the direction of the director. Course offerings include games, sports and defensive driving. New courses may be offered through community interest, provided a qualified instructor can be secured and a sufficient number of people register for the course. TEEN CENTER

Held at Lynbrook North and South middle schools, the Teen Center is a 14-week program open to Lynbrook students in grades 6-8. Seven sessions are held at each school. Students meet on Friday evenings during the late fall and winter months, from 7-9 p.m., and participate in basketball, volleyball and board games. They also have the opportunity to socialize in an informal setting.

RIGHT AT SCHOOL PROGRAM

Before Care/After Care Program: Kindergarten – Grade 5

The Lynbrook School District is pleased to offer a structured and safe before care/after care program through a continued partnership with Right at School, providing a valuable support for working families. Right At School's before care/after care program offers a nurturing and well-organized environment where children can complete homework, enjoy a healthy snack, and participate in enriching activities such as fitness, team building, and leadership development. Flexible scheduling options, including drop-in care, allow families to tailor the service to their needs.

Before Care Program: Kindergarten - Grade 5 (Monday – Friday) designed for students in grades Kindergarten through 5, runs from 7-8:30 a.m. at the Kindergarten and elementary schools.

After Care Program: Kindergarten - Grade 5 (Monday – Friday) runs from 3-6:30 p.m. at all three elementary schools and from 2:30-6:30 p.m. at the Kindergarten Center.

Extended Summer Program: Kindergarten – Grade 5 (July - August: 6 Weeks)

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

New residents who wish to register their children in the Lynbrook School District in grades K-12 can complete an online registration form located on the district's website.

KINDERGARTEN ENTRANCE REQUIREMENTS: A child may be registered for kindergarten in September if he or she will be 5 years old on or before Dec. 1. Proof of age must be presented upon registration. A birth certificate or passport is acceptable proof of age.

RECORDS NEEDED: Parents are required to present a birth certificate at the time of registration. For children who are not U.S. citizens, a passport is acceptable. All documents must be in English. Proof of residence, a school district #20 tax bill, must be presented at time of registration. It is mandatory that all children have a complete physical examination before September. The school district requires proof of these examinations, proof of immunization and the medical history of each child. Refer to the district website for more information.

STUDENT RECORDS

The Board of Education recognizes the legal requirement to maintain the confidentiality of student records. The procedures for ensuring the confidentiality of student records shall be consistent with state and federal statutes, including the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974 (FERPA) and its implementing regulations.

The Board also recognizes its responsibility to ensure the orderly retention and disposition of the district's student records in accordance with Schedule ED-1 as adopted by the Board in Policy 1120.

The superintendent of schools shall be responsible for ensuring that all requirements under federal statutes and commissioner's regulations shall be carried out by the district.

It is district policy to disclose personally identifiable information from student records, without consent, to other school officials within the district whom the district has determined to have legitimate educational interests. Information will also be released to third-party representatives for educational program audit, evaluation, enforcement or compliance purposes. For purposes of this policy, a school official is a person employed by the district as an administrator, supervisor, instructor or support staff member (including health or medical staff and law enforcement unit personnel), a member of the Board of Education, a person or company with whom the district has contracted to perform a special task (such as an attorney, auditor, medical consultant or therapist), or a parent or student serving on an official committee (such as a disciplinary or grievance committee) or assisting another school official performing his or her tasks. A school official has a legitimate educational interest if the official needs to review a student record to fulfill his or her professional responsibilities.

Upon request, the district will disclose education records without consent to officials of another school district in which a student seeks or intends to enroll.

Parents, guardians and eligible students currently in attendance, or who enroll during the school year, have the right under FERPA to:

- Inspect and review the student's education records;
- Request that records be amended to ensure that they are not inaccurate, misleading or otherwise in violation of the student's privacy or other rights;
- Consent to disclosure of personally identifiable information from the student's educational records, except to the extent that FERPA authorizes disclosure without consent;
- File a complaint with the U.S. Department of Education alleging failure of the district to comply with FERPA and its regulations; and
- Inspect, review and request amendment of student records.

DIRECTORY INFORMATION OF STUDENTS

The district shall maintain directory information regarding its students. Directory information consists of personal information about individual students and includes the student's name, address, telephone listing, date and place of birth, major field of study, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, and previous educational institutions attended. Directory information shall be disclosed for limited purposes. Any objection to such disclosure of directory information, and any request to be excluded from the list of directory information to be disclosed, shall be submitted in writing to the superintendent of schools no later than three weeks after this or any school or districtwide advertising of this policy has been read.

ANNUAL PROFESSIONAL PERFORMANCE REVIEW DISCLOSURE

Each school district shall fully disclose and release to the parent/legal guardian of a student the final quality rating and composite effectiveness score for each of the teachers and for the principal of the school building to which the student is assigned for the current school year upon the request of such parent/legal guardian. The parent/legal guardian may review and receive such data in any manner including by phone or in person; shall receive an oral or written explanation of the composite effectiveness scoring ranges for final quality ratings; and be offered opportunities to understand such scores.

INSTRUCTIONAL TECHNOLOGY

The Lynbrook Union Free School District remains committed to advancing technology integration and computer literacy for all students in grades K–12, recognizing the vital role these skills play in student success both now and in the future. Our district has built a robust, high-speed, fiberoptic infrastructure that provides every classroom with secure access to internet and intranet resources. This network supports daily use of global digital content—ranging from interactive lessons in science and math to multimedia resources in reading, social studies, and the arts.

For the 2025–26 school year, the district will continue to support its 1:1 device program for students in grades 2 through 12, issuing laptops to enable access to digital learning anytime and anywhere. Students in kindergarten and first grade will have access to classroom devices during the school day, ensuring early exposure to age-appropriate technology in a guided, developmentally appropriate environment.

The Lynbrook Board of Education supports a forward-thinking vision for instructional technology, backed by a long-range strategic plan. This includes providing each classroom with multimedia instructional tools, districtwide wireless connectivity, access to virtual classrooms, and a wide array of online learning resources. Teachers benefit from ongoing professional development designed to keep them current with educational technology trends and to help them meaningfully incorporate digital tools into their daily instruction.

The district utilizes secure, age-appropriate digital learning platforms that foster organized, engaging, and interactive learning environments. These systems enhance communication between teachers, students, and families—encouraging collaboration and extending learning beyond the classroom walls.

Thanks to the continued support of the Lynbrook community, our schools remain well-equipped to prepare students for the demands of the 21st century with the tools, knowledge, and skills they need to thrive.

SHARED DECISION-MAKING: BUILDING COMPACT COMMITTEES

Each school within the district has a Shared Decision-making Committee called the Compact Committee, which is comprised of an administrator, teachers, parents, support staff, and, where appropriate, students. Building committees meet monthly from September through June of each school year to collaboratively address issues such as curriculum, student achievement, school operations including budget, student belonging, social emotional learning, and mental health supports. Each meeting has time for public comment. If you are interested in attending a building compact meeting, you may call the main office of the school for a meeting date, time and location. Although all schools list their compact meetings on the calendar, these dates are tentative and are subject to change.

THE PARENT-TEACHER ASSOCIATIONS OF THE LYNBROOK SCHOOL DISTRICT

THE ROLE OF PTA

The role of PTA is to establish good home and school relationships so that parents and teachers can work cooperatively to improve the educational experience of the children in our schools. PTA strives to encourage parent and community involvement and to assist parents in developing skills they need to raise and protect their children. Nassau Region PTA serves more than 300 PTA units and 30 Council units. The Lynbrook School District PTAs are committed to uniting the home, school and community in promoting the education, health and welfare of the children, youth and families in our district.

LYNBROOK COUNCIL OF PTAs

Lynbrook Council of PTAs is the coordinating body for each of the district's individual PTAs and SEPTA. Members of Council's Executive Board and Executive Committee, which includes the presidents of each individual PTA unit, meet monthly to conduct Council business and address parental concerns within the district.

PTA Council recognizes the need for interparent communication and a cooperative learning environment within our school community. To provide parent education to address important issues affecting our school and community and the well-being of the children in our district, Council hosts multiple Parent University events, which are listed in the calendar. Parents and community members are encouraged to attend. PTA Council also organizes the Lynbrook Scholarship Fund through an annual "Fly with the Owls" Scholarship 5K and other district and community events, directs a Curriculum Committee to research important areas of curriculum, and hosts the annual Founders' Day Celebration and Meet the Candidates Night.

By working cooperatively with the district administration, Council can fulfill its mission to be a voice for our children, a resource for parents and an advocate for a strong public education.

SEPTA

SEPTA stands for Special Education PTA. The Lynbrook SEPTA represents a diverse population of students from preschool to high school, their parents and teachers. These children may be classified students, 504 students or students identified as gifted and talented. SEPTA was organized to support, strengthen and promote a greater awareness of special education and to encourage and promote an understanding of students' needs, while striving to develop and implement ways of meeting them.

ASBESTOS COMPLIANCE

The district's regular maintenance of the schools includes asbestos inspection in all facilities. In compliance with the Asbestos Hazard Emergency Response Act (AHERA), we undertake the following: reinspect all buildings and spaces every three years for all asbestos-containing building material; visually inspect the condition of all known asbestos within the buildings every six months; sample previously tested building materials suspected of containing asbestos; and update our asbestos management plan. Several members of the district's custodial and maintenance staff are trained and certified in the handling and removal of asbestos-containing materials. Their training is updated on a regular basis. The reinspection and updated management plans are available for review in the main office of each building and at the district office.

PESTICIDE NOTIFICATION

The Lynbrook U.F.S.D. strives to control problems using Integrated Pest Management (IPM) Techniques. IPM is a process for managing, preventing and suppressing pests with minimal impact on human health, the environment and nontarget organisms. IPM incorporates all reasonable measures by properly identifying, monitoring and controlling pests through the use of cultural, physical, biological and chemical control methods. Pesticides may be utilized periodically throughout the year but must only be used as a last resort, and if pesticides are needed, the least toxic, pest-specific alternative must always be selected. Any student, parent/guardian or staff member may register to receive written notification 48 hours prior to a regulated pesticide application. Individuals may request that their names be added to the school registry at any time during the school year by contacting Mr. James Saitta, director of facilities, at (516) 887-0259.

VISITOR PROTOCOLS

All visitors must have an appointment and must bring a government-issued photo identification (e.g., driver's license, nondriver ID card, passport) to gain entrance into any district facility.

- Visitors will push the button on the intercom on the outer door and state the purpose for the visit.
- Monitor will confirm the appointment. If appointment is confirmed, the monitor will admit the visitor into the security vestibule.
- Once in vestibule, the monitor will assess the visitor's demeanor and will contact an administrator should any suspicious or unusual behavior be evident.
- After passing an initial assessment, the monitor will admit the visitor.
- The visitor will approach the security desk where the monitor will evaluate the visitor's governmentissued photo identification.
- The monitor will give the visitor a visitor's badge that must always be worn while in the building.
- The visitor will be escorted to his or her destination.
- After the visitor's business in the building is completed, the visitor will be escorted to the security desk
 and surrender the visitor's badge.

CODE OF CONDUCT

The Board of Education has adopted a Code of Conduct as required by state law to promote a safe, respectful, and inclusive learning environment. It outlines student rights and responsibilities, behavioral expectations, disciplinary procedures, and the roles of students, parents, staff, and administrators. The Code addresses prohibited conduct such as harassment, cyberbullying, violence, and substance use, and emphasizes progressive discipline focused on fairness, accountability, and growth. It includes guidelines for respectful dress, appropriate use of personal and internet-enabled devices, and permits authorized personnel to search students or their belongings when there is reasonable suspicion of a violation, while lockers and desks are school property and may be inspected at any time. The Code complies with the Dignity for All Students Act and names trained Dignity Act Coordinators in each school. Students receive a summary copy, and full versions are available through the school office or district website.

INTERNET-ENABLED DEVICES AND PERSONAL ELECTRONIC DEVICES

To minimize distractions and promote student well-being, the Board of Education prohibits student use of internet-enabled personal electronic devices (such as smartphones, smartwatches, and tablets) during the school day on school grounds, except as permitted by an IEP, 504 plan, other special exceptions as defined by law, or with administrative approval for specific instructional purposes. All such devices must be turned off and stored in lockers or backpacks. The policy also discourages the use of other personal devices and allows staff to enforce restrictions during school events. Violations may result in confiscation and consequences aligned with the Code of Conduct. Parents may contact their children during the day through the school office or district email. A full version of the Policy 5695, Students and Personal Electronic Devices, is available on the district website and will be translated upon request.

LOCKDOWN/SECURE LOCKOUT PROCEDURES

As part of our building and district safety plans, we will periodically practice "lockdown" and "secure lockout" procedures throughout the district.

A lockdown situation occurs when an imminent threat is within a building. An announcement will be made over the building's public address system. All teachers will check the hallways and bathrooms for stray students and lock their doors. During that period of time, no one will be allowed in or out of the rooms or in or out of the building.

Should there be a danger or threat posed outside the building, the school district will enter into a secure lockout and in a secure lockout situation, all exterior doors are locked. No visitors or unauthorized personnel may enter the building. No person is permitted to leave the building during a secure lockout. The district may declare a secure lockout for the entire district, multiple buildings or only one building depending on information received from law enforcement.

As soon as it is practicable, parents will be alerted regarding the imposition and subsequent lifting of lockdown or secure lockout situations by use of ParentSquare, the district website and the district Facebook page. Parents will receive information regarding dismissal and reunification procedures at that time. There are times when a secure lockout or lockdown may last beyond dismissal time. In these cases, students will remain supervised in the school buildings until the district has updated information from law enforcement. Parents should not come to the schools during secure lockout or lockdown situations as crowds will only complicate the efforts of law enforcement.

DANGEROUS WEAPONS POLICY

In accordance with federal law, the Board of Education prohibits a student from bringing to school or having in his or her possession on school premises and/or at school-related functions held on other than school premises, any knife, firearm or weapon capable of inflicting bodily harm. A student who is found guilty of possession of a weapon, after a hearing is provided in accordance with Education Law 3214, is subject to a mandatory penalty of suspension for at least one year. The complete District Dangerous Weapons Policy is on file in the superintendent's office.

NOTIFICATION OF RELEASED SEX OFFENDERS POLICY

The Board of Education recognizes its responsibility for the health and safety of the students enrolled in the district's schools and for those youngsters participating in the district's programs or events. The Board desires that appropriate precautionary measures be taken in the event the district receives information from local law enforcement concerning sex offenders who reside within the district's boundaries. It is the policy of the Board that whenever such information is received from local law enforcement officials, the information shall be disseminated to the superintendent and assistant superintendents, and on the Megan's Law website. The complete district policy is on file in the superintendent's office and may be examined upon request.

THE DISTRICT

Founded in 1892, the Lynbrook Union Free School District is dedicated to excellence in education achieved through the quality of instructional programs, innovative extracurricular activities and special areas geared to individual student needs. The athletic and fine and performing arts departments, as well as school clubs and activities, complete the total educational program.

BOUNDARIES

The Lynbrook Union Free School District and the Village of Lynbrook are two separate units of government, each entirely independent of the other. The school district and the Village do not share common boundary lines. The school district includes most of the Village of Lynbrook and parts of the unincorporated areas of Lynbrook, as well as portions of East Rockaway, Hewlett, Hewlett Harbor and Valley Stream. SIX-DAY CYCLE SCHEDULING

All schools in the district operate on a six-day class schedule cycle. Classes are offered on day one, two, three, four, five or six, or some combination of days one through six. To illustrate, assume John Smith was scheduled to have physical education on days one, three and six. By having a six-day cycle schedule in lieu of a Monday-through-Friday schedule, John will not miss a physical education class due to a holiday. The six-day cycle is printed on this calendar.

EMERGENCY SCHOOL CLOSINGS

Arrangements have been made to notify the general public by radio and television whenever schools are to be closed because of weather conditions. Announcements will be made beginning at 6 a.m. and may be broadcast intermittently over the following cable TV stations: News 12, CBS 2, NBC 4, FOX 5, and ABC 7.

Announcements will also be posted on the district website, www.lynbrookschools.org, sent to households via ParentSquare, and posted on the district's Facebook page. All activities, field trips and programs in schools and on school grounds will be canceled.

DELAYED OPENINGS

In the event of inclement weather, the Lynbrook School District may have a two-hour delayed opening. A delayed opening might occur when it is obvious that a storm has ended or is about to end, the streets have not yet been satisfactorily cleared, but the roads should be safe for travel within a few hours. Delaying the opening of school by two hours will enable students to receive instruction rather than close the school for an entire day. In a delayed opening, all schools would simply open exactly two hours after they would normally open. Additionally, in-district and out-of-district students who receive bus transportation would be picked up two hours later than they usually are. All morning clubs, extra help and other morning activities would be canceled when there is a delayed opening. Parents are advised to watch for the buses, as road conditions could cause buses to arrive earlier or later than expected. Afternoon dismissals and bus schedules beyond the first two hours of the day would remain unchanged.

High School: 9:30 a.m. (Period 1) (Modified bell schedule on district website)

EARLY DISMISSAL

The decision to call an early dismissal will be made before the school day begins so families can make arrangements for an early pickup. The decision will not be made while school is in session. **If nothing is posted by 6:30 a.m., assume there will be a normal school schedule.**

In the event of inclement weather, the Lynbrook Public Schools may need to implement a two-hour early dismissal. An early dismissal might occur when the weather forecast predicts that a storm may not begin until early afternoon, thus making the afternoon dismissal difficult. By dismissing two hours earlier rather than closing the school for an entire day, students will receive substantial instruction. In an early dismissal, all schools would be dismissed exactly two hours earlier than the normally scheduled dismissal time. Additionally, in-district and out-of-district students who receive bus transportation would be picked up two hours earlier than they usually are. All afternoon clubs, extra help, after-school care program and other after-school activities would be canceled. Parents are advised to watch for the buses, as road conditions could cause buses to arrive earlier or later than expected.

Elementary Schools: 1 p.m.

Middle Schools: 12:40 p.m. (Modified bell schedule on district website)

High School: 12:52 p.m. (Period 10) (Modified bell schedule on district website)

Should a child not be picked up by a preapproved adult, the district will exhaust all emergency contacts in order to ensure each child is picked up earlier.

If more than two delayed openings or early dismissals are used, another day will need to be made up.

ParentSquare offers a unified platform for school communication, providing seamless messaging, attendance alerts, and event updates to keep parents informed and engaged. Additionally, ParentSquare supports multiple languages, ensuring accessibility for all families, and features real-time notifications for immediate updates. The app is available in the Apple and Google Play stores, with links provided on the district webpage.

DAYS OF RELIGIOUS OBSERVANCE

The State Education Department has compiled a list of days of religious observance. While not all-inclusive, the list contains the most important liturgical dates of several religious faiths. With the exception of Dec. 25 and Jan. 1, these days are not legal holidays. Attendance registers will be maintained as on other days of session. Children who are absent from school for religious observance on days that school is in session will be afforded every opportunity to make up schoolwork that was missed during their absence.

TRANSPORTATION: PUBLIC & NONPUBLIC

Transportation is currently provided for elementary school children, grades 1 to 5, living at a distance in excess of 1 mile; grades 6 to 8 living at a distance in excess of 2 miles; and for secondary school students living at a distance of at least 3 miles from school. All children enrolled in kindergarten will be eligible for transportation. It must be understood that bus stops for kindergarten change annually based on the residences of the newly enrolled students. Stops may not repeat from one year to the next. Eligible private school children will be transported a maximum of 15 miles. Pupils qualifying for transportation service, whether public or nonpublic, must apply in writing to the Office of the Superintendent of Schools *before April 1 of the preceding school year*. New district residents must apply within 30 days of moving into the district.

WORKING PAPERS

Working papers are required by law for students under the age of 18 who seek employment. Students who require working papers may obtain the application from the high school web page.
