

# LHS Update August 27, 2021



# School reopens Thursday, September 9th!

# Dear LHS Community,

I hope this update finds you and your family well, and that summer gave you the opportunity to rest, to recharge, and to visit with family and friends. As you know construction and renovations at LHS have been in full swing and will be wrapping up just in time for the opening of school after Labor Day. On August 11<sup>th</sup> the Board of Education approved the recommendations of the community task force regarding the start of school. In summary the approved recommendations are:

- ALL students and staff are back for in-person learning.
- We are returning to our pre-COVID schedule, including arrival and dismissal times, bell transitions, locker and locker room use.
- We are NOT requiring the daily health screening; however, if you feel sick, stay home!
- We still have the portable washing stations, and frequent hand washing and use of sanitizer is encouraged.
- We will maintain three feet of social distancing where possible, including in the music content areas.
- We require all students and staff to wear masks for all indoor instruction and activities. This includes bus



transportation. Masks must be worn on buses. Masks are not required for outdoor activities.

- We will NOT conduct contact tracing in classes since the wearing of masks is a requirement. We will NOT quarantine healthy individuals if masks are worn.
- When eating in the cafeteria, masks are not worn but 6 feet of space must be maintained. If one is vaccinated and is exposed at lunchtime, quarantine will not be necessary if no symptoms are exhibited. However, one needs to get tested 3-5 days after exposure. Proof of vaccination will be required.
- We have eliminated the polycarbonate partitions except for speech classes, where viewing one's mouth is vital to instruction and masks are necessarily removed.

As we reopen a number of things are on the minds of the staff of the high school. Our areas of focus for the year include:

- Re-establishing pre-Covid building procedures and practices while simultaneously being ready to make changes should it become necessary.
- Helping students adapt back to the rigors of the daily home/school routine.
- Identifying students in need of support as well as the areas of support required.
- Providing academic as well as social/emotional support for all students throughout the year.

# **Schedule Changes**

All requests for course changes must contain the following information:

Student name and grade, Name of Guidance Counselor, Course(s) to be dropped, Course(s) to be added, Parent name, and Telephone number.

In order to accommodate the academic needs of all students, the following schedule change requests will not be honored: Start of day or end of day, Specific lunch period, Specific free period, Teacher change

Be sure to included student name, grade, and counselor name in the subject line of the e-mail.

# The last day to request a change in schedule is Wednesday, September 15th.

With regard to materials, we recommend that students plug in and leave on their tablets so that the technology department can update the machines. Mr. MacDermott will be sending you a message about this. On day one, all students should bring a pen, pencil, a notebook, and their tablet and charger.

# **COVID Testing**

The district will be offering rapid COVID testing on September 9<sup>th</sup> for all who wish to be tested before the year begins. The link to use to submit your information prior to testing

You will not need to resubmit your information. Based on the number of people who take advantage of this service, we may offer the testing on a routine basis during the school year.

#### **Building Entrances Procedures**

In the morning there will be two ways for students to enter the building; the front entrance on Union Avenue, and the entrance by the Athletic office. The Athletic office entrance will close at 8:10 am each morning. After 8:10 all students and staff are to enter and exit the building using the main entrance only. The main entrance is the set of doors directly adjacent to the crosswalk to the parking lot.

All visitors to the high school must have an appointment in order to gain entry. Before entering the building, all visitors are to check in with the guard outside the main entrance. Visitors must be masked and will need to sign in at the foyer window and must wait to be escorted into the building.
