Acceptable Use Policy Reminder:

This school year the school district moved to digital signatures for the Acceptable Use Policy and offered an online payment option for tablet insurance. In December, the school buildings reached out to individual families that are missing one or both required documents. As of January, more than 500 students/families in our district have not submitted the Acceptable Use Policy and/or tablet insurance payments. It is important to note that any family that has not paid \$27 for tablet insurance is responsible for the full replacement value of the tablet (\$600) if it is stolen or vandalized.

Additionally, students whose parents have not signed off on the Acceptable Use Policy will have restrictions put on their accounts until the form is signed.

SNOW DAYS:

Closings, Delays and Early Dismissals



Emergency School Closings:

- Announcements will be made beginning at 6 a.m.
- All activities, field trips and programs in schools and on school grounds are canceled.

Two-Hour Delayed Opening:

- Announcements will be made beginning at 6 a.m.
- All schools will open exactly two hours after they would normally open:
 - ★ Kindergarten Center: 10:30 a.m.
 - ★ Elementary Schools: 10:30 a.m.
 - ★ Middle Schools: 10 a.m.
(Modified bell schedule on district website)
 - ★ High School: 9:30 a.m. (Period 1)
(Modified bell schedule on district website)
- Bus transportation begins two hours later than normal pickup time. Afternoon dismissals and bus schedules beyond the first two hours of the day will remain unchanged.
- All morning clubs, extra help and other morning activities will be canceled.

Early Dismissal:

- The decision to call an early dismissal will be made before the school day begins.
 - All schools will be dismissed exactly two hours earlier than the normally scheduled dismissal time.
 - ★ Kindergarten Center: 12:30 p.m.
 - ★ Elementary Schools: 1 p.m.
 - ★ Middle Schools: 12:40 p.m.
 - ★ High School: 12:52 p.m. (Period 10)
(Modified bell schedules on district website)
 - Bus transportation begins two hours earlier than normal time.
 - All afternoon clubs, extra help, after-school care program and other after-school activities will be canceled.
- ★ If nothing is posted by 6:30 a.m., assume there will be a normal school schedule. ★

How Many Snow Days Are in the 2021-2022 School Calendar?

There are 183 days in the 2021-2022 school calendar. If we use **MORE** than three days for inclement weather or emergency purposes, we will need to reclaim instructional days by either pivoting to remote learning or dipping into recess breaks.
